








Distribution of Medicaid Costs for SD w/FBA age 20 and below





Progress, and more is needed

- We now can answer questions about
 - distribution and costs,
 - by age, by ISPM scores, by geography
 - Split based on whether SD was selected.
- We still do not have data about
 - Services delivered compared to services authorized
 - Higher needs funding
 - Non-medicaid spend
 - Medical spend



Evero Data: Total IDGS Budgeted & Spent by Age




IDGS Spent (annualized) IDGS Budgeted







A starting list for Future advocacy

Possible items for action

- Identify and remove the barriers encountered by Black & African-American DSPs who are seeking to become supervisors.
- Allow SDers to choose Basic CM, and move the other 75% of Comprehensive fee into their budget.
- Make it easier to get Higher Needs Funding, specifically so it is available to
 - More people who need extra support
 - People who have selected SD w/FBA
- Increase caps on sub-categories of spend, starting with IDGS
- Remove constraints that make it difficult for people to spend their IDGS budget

For data, routine reporting of

- State-only money in addition to Medicaid (OTPS, Housing subsidy...)
- Unmet needs
 - Certified services authorized versus delivered
 - SD budgeted versus spent.
- Higher Needs Funding
- Medical, split by those in straight Medicaid versus Managed Care.
 - Counts, costs
 - Health outcomes.
